

- The Father's answer reveals His faithfulness to His servants by His promise to glorify Himself again and again and again!—there was indeed strength to bear it—the Father had glorified His own name and had brought glory to the Son throughout all of his ministry. He would not stop now!
 - 1:14 In a general way, the Word (the Son) displayed the Father's glory through grace and truth. He owned this glory as the only unique Son of the Father of glory.
 - 2:11 Jesus' miracles revealed His glory--**John 2:11** ¹¹ This beginning of *His* signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.
 - 7:18 The Father was Jesus' basis of authority, this proves that He was seeking the Father's glory, and vindicates Jesus as having the truth and of being righteous—this leads into 8:50. Jesus proves this truthfulness and righteousness and that he is not self-glorifying by obeying Him--something his opponents did not do, even though they knew his Word 8:54-55
 - 11:4 God glorified himself through Lazarus' death and resurrection, and glorified the Messiah at the same time.
 - More obviously, God had put Jesus' chosen, glorious status as Messiah on display at his baptism by John, at the transfiguration on the mountain
 - Matthew 3:16-17 ¹⁶ After being baptized, Jesus came up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove and lighting on Him, ¹⁷ and behold, a voice out of the heavens said, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased."
 - **Mark 9:1-7** And Jesus was saying to his disciples, "Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who will not taste death until they see the kingdom of God after it has come with power." ² Six days later, Jesus took with Him Peter and James and John, and brought them up on a high mountain by themselves. And He was transfigured before them; ³ and His garments became radiant and exceedingly white, as no launderer on earth can whiten them. ...they became terrified. ⁷ Then a cloud formed, overshadowing them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is My Beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to Him!"
